Dear Chairman Trillanes:

We are writing in response to your recent press comment on the debate on amendments to the provisions of the 1987 Philippine Constitution that restrict foreign investment and the practice of professions.

As Chairman of the Committee on Civil Service, we believe that you have the opportunity to remove indirectly the restriction on professions via legislation as you have proposed. By introducing the principle of reciprocity in several bills regulating professions being tackled by your Committee you liberalize the practice of profession by allowing foreigners to practice their profession.

The constitution creates a policy bias in favor of Philippine citizens, but not a strict legal barrier to the participation of foreign professionals. Although the constitutional language states that "the practice of all professions in the Philippines shall be limited to Filipino citizens," this statement is immediately followed by "save in cases prescribed by law." There are 47 laws governing the practice of specific professions, and 42 contain "reciprocity" provisions allowing foreigners to practice their profession in the Philippines, provided their countries of origin also allows Filipinos to practice these. Five laws regulating criminologists, environmental planners, foresters, pharmacists, and radio and x-ray technologists state the profession is restricted to Philippine nationals and contain no reciprocity provision.

By inserting a reciprocity provision in the above laws, the Congress will in effect make the restriction in the Constitution a dead letter.

We commend your Committee for regularly conducting hearings on bills regulating the practice of various professions. We were informed that your committee has already conducted hearings and/or technical working group

meetings on bills pertaining to the following profession: civil engineering, medicine, mining engineering, interior design, environmental planning, and geology. We hope that your Committee can ensure that the below reciprocity provision is inserted in the above bills:

"No foreign shall be given a certificate of registration/professional license and professional identification card or be entitled to any of the privileges under this Act unless the country or state of which he is a subject or a citizen permits Filipino to practice within its territorial limits on the same basis as the subjects or citizens of said country or state."

Senate Bills 746 and 2163, regulating the practice of pharmacy in the Philippines, repealing Republic Act 5921, as amended, are scheduled to be heard by your Committee on August 23, 2011. We hope that the provision restricting this profession to Philippine nationals is removed and replaced with the reciprocity language above.

We are pleased to have attended the Technical Working Group meeting on the environmental planning conducted most professionally by your Chief of Staff, Atty. Ray Robles and that the Committee considers replacing the nationality restriction with reciprocity. With the enactment of the bills on pharmacy and environmental planning, there will be only three remaining laws restricted to Filipino citizens. We encourage you to seek amendments of these three laws as well to complete the suggested legislative approach to amend the Constitution.

We would be happy to elaborate on the above at any hearing / Technical Working Group meeting to be called by your Committee on any of the relevant bills.
