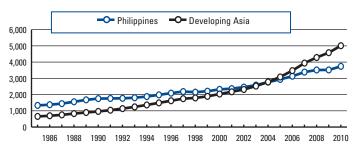

GDP (PPP) per capita (int'l \$), 1985-2010



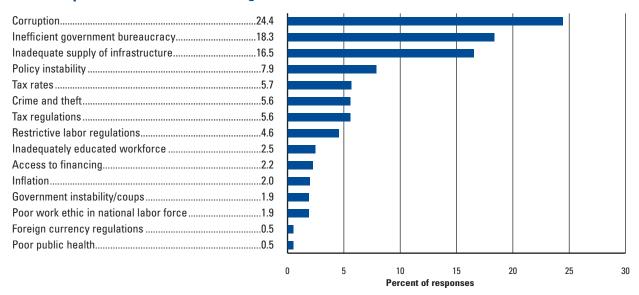
